Medicaid, a joint federal and state program, is also known as “Medical Assistance.” Medicaid provides access to health care services for certain low income Maryland residents. Some of Medicaid’s covered services include:

- Physician and specialist care
- Inpatient and outpatient services
- Prescription medications
- Blood and blood products
- Durable medical equipment and supplies
- Emergency room services, ambulance services
- Family planning services and supplies
- Home health services
- Hospice care
- Laboratory and x-ray services
- Medical day care services
- Mental health and substance abuse services
- Oxygen and dialysis services
- Personal care services
- Physical therapy
- Podiatry services
- Transportation for certain services
- Early Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment for children, such as:
 - Immunizations
 - Well child services
 - Assistive Technology
 - Vision, hearing, and dental screening and services
 - In-home behavioral supports.

A Maryland resident can become eligible for Medicaid in a number of ways:

- A person who receives even \$1 of Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA) is eligible to receive Medicaid
- A person who is enrolled in a Home and Community Based Waiver program like the DDA Community Pathways Waiver is eligible to receive Medicaid
- Children and pregnant women from low to middle income families can receive Medicaid through the Maryland Children's Health Program
- There are limited other options for some people with very high medical expenses and low income to obtain Medicaid. See: www.dhmf.state.md.us/mma/mmahome.html and click on Medical Care Programs Eligibility.
